THINGS TO KNOW:

The Baldwin 60,000 locomotive : The train is huge! You Walk up steps and a ramp to enter. You can blow the whistle from inside. On days when this room is crowded, you will continuously hear the whistle blowing.

Hint: There is an elevator that can take you up to the ramp; you can go in a wheelchair all the way to the entrance of the train locomotive, but you have to stand up and walk a few steps to actually go in.

Push to Spin: Push and pull the handles to get the wheels to spin. It can be slow to get started.

Hint: Push and pull in a smooth, even rhythm to make the wheels spin best.

Steam Pressure Pushes: You push a button to make this exhibit work. You will hear a noise and see a moving part.

Hint: If the noise bothers you, try using headphones or earplugs that are available at the Information Desk.

Diesel: You push a button to make this exhibit work. You will hear a popping noise and see a bright spark.

Hint: If the noise bothers you, try using headphones or earplugs that are available at the sensory day table.

Keeping on Track: You will have fun figuring out which shape object moves best on the track.
